Rules Governing Exhibits & Instructions to Exhibitors

1. The primary object of the Show is the improvement of Agriculture and livestock in all branches.
2. All stock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
3. All stock must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months previous to date of Show. Confined Classes are for residents of County Westmeath only.
4. Pens will be provided for exhibits in all cattle classes. Bulls exhibited at the show must be secured by a ring in the nose, with a strong rope or chain attached. The Society shall have the right to order the removal of any animal that they consider dangerous and shall not be responsible for any injury or damage caused by such animals.
5. With regard to cattle, where “pure-bred” stock is mentioned, it is understood that the stock exhibited must be entered in or eligible for entry in the various Herd Books. **N.B.** – In the case of bulls, the date of birth must be stated on the entry form.
6. In all classes for heifers, a “heifer” is classified as a heifer until she has a calf.
7. All animals must be shown at owner’s risk. The Society will not be accountable for any accident, damage or loss of exhibit.
8. The farm and garden produce must have been grown on the exhibitor’s land and a declaration to that effect, signed by two respectable householders living in the immediate locality and approved by the Society, may be required from each prize-winner before prizes are paid.
9. All stock, produce etc., to be in the Show Yard by **10.00.a.m.** on the morning of the Show.
10. Prizes will be awarded in all classes except Pedigree Classes where there is sufficient merit; the Judges will be distinctly instructed to withhold a prize where sufficient merit does not exist.
11. All Prizes disallowed or not awarded shall lapse to the Society.
12. Objections: All objections to the decision of the Judges must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, accompanied by a fee of €25.00, not later than one hour after the competition

finishes, on the date of the Show. The fee or fees so lodged will be forfeited if the objection or objections is or are considered to be frivolous.

13. **Entries:** The necessary forms can be had on application to the Secretary and no other forms can be received. All descriptions of stock as to age and breed must be stated when completing entry forms. This is a must, especially in respect of qualifiers and all horse and pony classes.

14. Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by the requisite entry fee. Phoned entries must be confirmed in writing.

15. If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Society that the owner or any person in his employment or under his control has been guilty of any violation of the rules or regulations, has made a false statement in the certificate of entry, or has secured an unfair advantage, the exhibitor shall forfeit all prizes awarded him at the Show, together with all fees paid by him, and shall be liable to be excluded from competing at this or any future show of the Society.

16. The Society shall reserve the right of declining or returning any exhibit without incurring any liability. In the event of the Society being unable to accept any entry, notice will be given within six days after the final closing of the entries. The fees lodged will be refunded.

17. No refund of entry fees in any class, including jumping competitions, will be made in case of entries, which are not sent forward for competition, or which are disqualified from competition for failure to comply with regulations.

18. No Steward can officiate in the ring who is an exhibitor in the class under adjudication.

19. IMPORTANT NOTICE: All Cattle Exhibitors are asked to pay special attention to the notice – “T.B & Brucellosis Testing of Animals”.

20. All exhibits must remain until 4.30.p.m.

21. Rosettes – Cup Award in purple and yellow. Prize colours – First Prize – RED; Second Prize – BLUE; Third Prize – YELLOW.

22. The award of Rosette or Prize Card does not imply that the entry is entitled to prize money.

23. All exhibits must bear their labels – otherwise they will be refused by the stewards.

24. In the Livestock Section – any class for which only one entry is received will be cancelled.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: In the Horse and Cattle classes no animal may win more than two first prizes.

NOTE: Anyone found interfering with any exhibit or disarranging any display will be asked to leave the grounds.

SPECIAL NOTICE: All children's ridden show pony classes shall be restricted to Mares and Geldings only. No animal shown in saddle classes shall be under three years of age. Mares with a living foal born current season shall not be shown in Saddle classes.

The Show is run under the Rules and Regulations of The Irish Shows Association and the Show Jumping Association of Ireland, the I.P.S. and the Side Saddle Association. All of which The Westmeath Show Society Ltd. is affiliated to.

N.B. Only those exhibitors entered in the catalogue are covered by the Show's insurance. All other exhibitors enter the Show on the express condition that they carry their own insurance and indemnify the Westmeath Show Society Ltd. against all liabilities.

Cancellation of Classes – The Committee reserve the right to cancel any class(es) due to insufficient entries.

It must be remembered by one and all that the success of the Show depends on the number of entries and members are invited to encourage interest in one or the other of the various classes. A special invitation to take an active part in the Irish Countrywomen's Association, Macra na Feirme and the Irish Farmers Association. Every facility will be given to intending entrants, young and new entrants are especially welcome. As many as possible of the exhibits will be under cover and there is a spacious car park. **We hope that you enjoy your day.**

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2009

A Eligibility of Shows

Shows wishing to participate in the 2010 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2009 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating show and must be strictly observed.

B Qualifying Rounds (Qualifiers)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C Responsibility of shows holding qualifying rounds

- a. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- b. The qualifier class should be held as the first class in the relevant section of the show.
- c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
- e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance at the Final.
- f. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.
- g. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.
- h. Shows must appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- i. Animal Passports must be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- j. On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- k. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
- l. Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the ISA within three days following the holding of the show.

N.B - Shows must return results card marked "NO QUALIFIER" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D Responsibility of Exhibitors

- a. Exhibitors accept that the judges' decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with **under f.** below.
- b. Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals or exhibits for the final in accordance with **j. & k.** above, within one hour of qualifying.
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The I.S.A. in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.
- f. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with a fee of €50.00, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

E Responsibilities of Shows Hosting Championship Finals

- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the Show and forwarded to the I.S.A. within 30 days of the final.
- b. Championship finals must start not later than 2.00.p.m. on the day of the show and the advertised time of starting must be adhered to as far as practicable, if necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

Notice of Interest to Championship Participants

Irish Law (EU Directive)

Under Irish Law, all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure that this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine of up to €3,000.00. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

- **Embryo Transfer: Where a foal is produced by this method, the dam's passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped, and signed by the Stallion Owner (or accredited practitioner where AI is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.**
- **The owners of Champions and Reserve Champions are invited to submit the animals' passports to the ISA head office where the placing will be endorsed and officially stamped with the seal of the ISA as a permanent record.**
- **It is in the interest of shows hosting championship finals that photographs and results are forwarded to the Irish Farmers Journal immediately following judging.**

CMMS Notification Cattle Movement

The movement of Irish Registered cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the state must be recorded on **AIM** using form **CMMS 4** (Forms available from your local DVO) ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 & 3 (a) of the CMM 4 form. Section 3 (b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the DVO in the County where the Show is being held within 7 days of movement. Keeper herd numbers for Agricultural Shows may be obtained from NBAS Division, Block B, Maynooth Business Park, Maynooth, Co. Kildare. Tel: 01-5053587.

Specific Requirements – Sheep

Identification

All sheep must be individually identified with plastic ear-tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by the completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded. Sheep from non-restricted flocks ONLY can be moved to shows.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in your flock register. Exports to Member States of the European Union including Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a certification laid down in Directive 91/68/EEC as amended. Organisers are advised to contact their Local District Veterinary Office well in advance of any show where sales may take place to determine the suitability of the show for exports (e.g. premises and sheep status), availability of veterinary staff for export certification and to have the necessary arrangements out in place.

Attendance of sheep from scrapie monitored flocks at shows and sales in 2010.

Shows between 1st May and 31st October

Sheep from Scrapie Monitored Flocks will be permitted to attend agricultural shows taking place between 1st May & 31st October without restriction or separation from other categories of sheep.

For shows taking place before May 1st or after 31st October, sheep from scrapie monitored or probationary flocks must be separated from other sheep as follows:

- a. There must be complete separation of monitored/probationary sheep from other categories of sheep at the show. Ideally, this would mean a separate entrance and exit for each group, separate loading and unloading areas, separate penning areas for each of the two groups.
- b. In locations where all of the above may not be possible, the minimum requirement would be the separate loading and unloading and also of penning areas. The two areas should be

separate by a sheep-free alleyway, at least 12 feet wide. If only one show-ring is available, the sheep from the scrapie-monitored flocks must be shown first.

SAFETY AT THE SHOW

Guidelines to note in relation to safety at the show

- Please observe signs – especially those relating to caution in livestock areas
- Please do not exhibit animals that are unsuitable with regard to safety – e.g. hard to control
- All animals must be led by a competent handler
- Animals should not be tied to trailers/horse boxes or left unattended
- Dogs should be on a lead and under the control of the handler
- Caution and care should be exercised at all times
- All horses and ponies must be led

- All exercises must be inside the practice arena

- At all times all animals must be under strict control

Rules for International Connemara Performance Championship classes:

1. Competitors must have qualified at approved shows.
2. Competitors must produce Connemara passports at qualifiers and Final.
3. Birth Certificates for under 16 year old riders are to be produced on the day of Final.
4. Stallions must have prior permission from the IPS/NPS/BSPS to compete and must be ridden by riders who have attained their 14th birthday by 1/1/10
5. Entry Fee to Final is €25.00 and must be returned with completed qualification paperwork in order to be entered in Final.
6. Prizes at the Final will go down to 6th place.
7. Fence heights at the Final in under 16 W.H. = 3' (92cms) in over 16 W.H. = 3' 3" (98cms) over a derby style course.
8. Qualifying fences must not exceed the fence heights as listed above.
9. At the Final the winner and 2nd placed competitor of each of the Five Finals will go forward for the Supreme Championship.
10. One pony and rider qualifies from each class should the winner of the class already have qualified, qualification moves down the line but no further than 4th place.

11. Ponies must be registered in the main Connemara Studbook or affiliated to Connemara Society's main studbook.

The decision of the CPPA and Performance Committee in all cases will be Final

- Class 7** **Show Ponies, Lead Rein**, 4 years and over, not exceeding 123cms, riders 7 years & under on 1/1/10

Rules for Powers Quarry 2010:

1. Qualifying rounds will be held at designated shows.
2. Ponies 4 years old and over are eligible
3. More than one pony in each qualifying class may be selected to compete in the final provided the judges agree that the standard is high enough.
4. Pony and/or rider once qualified are not eligible to participate in subsequent qualifiers. This rule may be waived by the Show Committee in exceptional circumstances e.g. sale of a pony or injury of rider prior to final. Permission from the Oughterard Show Committee must be granted prior to any previously qualified pony or rider competing in subsequent qualifying rounds. Failure to do will result in the entry not being accepted.
5. On completion of judging at qualifiers the successful qualifier will be given all relevant entry documentation by the ring steward. This must be completed and returned, along with the appropriate fee, to the secretary of the Oughterard show within 7 days – this rule will be strictly adhered to.
6. The Connemara Passport of each pony must be presented prior to judging at the qualifying show and on the day of the final.
7. The rider must be under 18 years on 01/01/2010.
Birth Certificates must be produced for inspection at qualifying rounds and on the day of the final.
8. Registered Connemara Stallions must be ridden by rider over 14 years and under 18 years on 01/01/10.
9. Ponies must be registered in a main Connemara Studbook.
10. Jumping over plain rustic fences will be part of the qualifying rounds and final. Qualifying rounds require 2 fences. The Final requires 4 fences. Jumps should not exceed 90cms in height and 90cms in width. Entrants from show who do not adhere to this rule will not be accepted.
11. Ponies to be ridden in a Plain Snaffle, Pelham or Double Bridle. Boots are allowed for the jumping phase only, and must be removed prior to the in-hand or flat Sections. Martingales and Spurs are prohibited.
12. A performance judge must be used at qualifying shows.
13. Ponies will be judged on type, confirmation, jumping technique, way of going and action in-hand.
14. Random Dope testing may be carried out on the day of the final.
15. Any objection must be lodged in writing with the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition, together with €50.00 which is refundable if the objection is upheld.
16. The Oughterard show committee, in consultation with the sponsor reserves the right to amend the rules as may be deemed necessary.

5. Those rules should be read in conjunction with the I.S.A. Rules.
